Policy is posted on the school's website, and in every classroom and the school's main office.		
Policy includes an enrollment letter for parents, students and staff, signifying that they have read and agree to the policy.		
Policy must be communicated to parents, staff, and students annually		
Policy must be reviewed every three years.
